- Summary of academic and career goals

2. Why This Course?

- o Connection between the course and your career objectives
- o Relevance of course content to your previous education and future plans

3. Why USA & This University?

- o Justify your choice of the USA and the specific institution
- Highlight unique program strengths or university features

4. Career Aspirations

- Long-term and short-term career goals
- o How the program will contribute to achieving them

5. Ties to Home Country

- o Explain your motivation to return after studies
- o Outline future contributions in your home country

6. Conclusion

- o Recap your main points
- o Reaffirm your commitment to the course and university
