- Education: Name of Institution, Degree(s), Major(s), Graduation Date, Honors or Awards
- Work Experience: List your work experience in reverse chronological order.
 Include the name of the company/organization, job title, dates of employment (month and year)
- References (available upon request): Instead of listing references directly on the CV mention that they are available upon request. Include the names, titles, contact information, and the context of your relationship with your references

SOP's GUIDELINES:

- Give a brief introduction of yourself and elaborate on the connectivity with this degree.
- Write the solid reasons for choosing (country e.g., UK, USA Australia ETC) for your further studies.
- Describe why you chose this specific university and this course.
- Narrate the grounds for how this course will help you in the future and connection with your previous degree.
- Elaborate on your future goals and your ties with your home Country.

SOP Structure:

- 1. Introduction: Begin with a concise introduction highlighting your goals and aspirations. You can briefly mention your background, academic achievements, and any relevant experiences that have led you to pursue the course.
- 2. Why this course? Show your genuine interest in the course and mention why you have chosen this particular program. You can write about how this course aligns with your career goals and what you hope to achieve by studying it. Mention the Course outlines that you are taking in that university.
- 3. Career Aspirations: Describe your career goals and explain how the program will help you achieve them. You can also mention your long-term goals and how you plan to use the knowledge gained from the program in your future endeavors.
- 4. Conclusion: Summarize your main points and reiterate your interest in the program. You can also mention how you can contribute to the program, and what you hope to gain from it.
